defeat in 1963 and his own  
forced departure from the  
leadership in 1967, a very  
public drama that divided his  
party and riveted the nation.  
When Diefenbaker died in  
1979, he was given a state  
funeral modeled - at his own  
direction - on those of  
Churchill and Kennedy. It  
culminated in a  
transcontinental train journey  
and burial on the bluffs  
overlooking Saskatoon,  
alongside the archive that  
houses his papers - the only  
presidential-style library built  
for a Canadian prime  
minister. Canadians embraced  
the image of Dief as a morally  
triumphant underdog, even as  
they were repelled by his  
outrageous excesses. He  
revived a moribund party and  
gave the country a fresh sense  
of purpose but he was no  
match for the dilemmas of the  
Cold War of Quebec  
nationalism, or the subtleties  
of the country's relations with  
the United States. This
