La Sonate à Kreutzer est une nouvelle en langue russe de Léon Tolstoï qu'il écrivit dans sa maison de Moscou et qui fut publiée en 1889. Le titre fait référence à la Sonate pour violon et piano no 9 en la majeur, dite "Sonate à Kreutzer", de Beethoven, que joue l'un des protagonistes de l'ouvrage. Le texte a inspiré par la suite plusieurs œuvres musicales, dont le premier quatuor de Leoš Janáček. Il a également été porté plusieurs fois à l'écran.
